#### **4-H Shooting Sports**

The Grant County 4-H Shooting Sports practices monthly from January - June and host fair competition shoots in July and August. Shooting disciplines offered are Air Rifle, Archery, Air Pistol, .22 Rifle and Shotgun. In the winter months we are able to practice Archery and Air Rile indoors and the summer months we practice all disciplines outside. All equipment to participate is provided but youth are welcome to bring their own to practice if they prefer. Equipment safety checks will happen at the beginning of practice.



#### Participant Requirements:

- Archery and Air Rifle is open to any youth in 3rd grade and above.
- 22 Rifle, Air Pistol and Shotgun: youth must be 12 years or older and have completed hunter safety to participate.
- Members must enroll in one or more of the following projects they plan to practice in via 4hOnline by April 1; Air Rifle, Air Pistol, Archery, .22 Rifle. Shotgun or Shooting Sports.
- If you plan to compete in a fair competition shoot youth must attend at least two practices to participate in Fair Shoots.

#### **Dog Project Practices & Information**

Are you interested in learning more about the 4-H dog show? Stop by a practice at the Grant County Fairgrounds and see what it is all about! Practice starts at 6:00 pm and generally lasts until 7:30 pm.

Below are what the kids and dogs will be working on and when:

- July 16-Obidience mock show
- July 18- Showmanship mock show
- July 23- Agility mock show
- July 25 & 30 make up days

Participates are strongly encouraged to make these practices. We will run the practice very similar to how it will be show day, with Deb as acting judge.

Here is what you can expect to learn from joining the dog project (not a complete list)

- 1. Heeling
- 2. Patterns
  - a. Down and back and L shape are the most popular.
  - b. Hand switches
- 3. Long sit and down
  - a. First years or new dogs (pre-novice) 1 min sit and 1 min down
  - b. Novice 1 min sit and 3 min down
  - c. Graduate Novice 3 min down handler out of sight, 5 min down handler out of sight
- Recall
- 5. Stacking (the art of physically placing the dog's feet in the best position.)
- 6. Dog body parts and basic dog care

The dog show is Tuesday, August 13 starting at 3:00 pm with agility starting around 5:00 pm. The livestock trust food stand will be open (with a limited menu) and the kids are having a silent auction. There was a lot of fun stuff on the auction last year and we hope you can make it out to support our kids!

#### 4-H Club Annual Financial Review

Every year each 4-H Club or 4-H Group with their own checkbook is required to complete the 4-H Annual Financial Review to be in compliance with the 501c3 tax exempt status. Again, this year the form has received some updates and additional supporting documents are required to be turned in. https://4h.extension.wisc.edu/resources/volunteer-resources/administrative/charter/

The Annual Financial Form is due to Extension Office before September 1, 2024. This deadline is extremely important! If forms are not turned in on time you could lose your tax exempt and club status.

Forms can be found at the website above and Charisse will be emailing club leaders and groups with forms and guidelines to complete all the steps to successfully complete the Annual Financial Report. If you have any questions please reach out to Charisse.

If your club is looking for a community service opportunity; Christmas for Kids is looking for volunteers to help with their event at Legion Park in Platteville on Saturday, July 13.

Christmas for Kids - Southwest WI is hosting Christmas In July on Saturday, July 13, 2024 from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm. This event is a carnival-midway-game style fundraising event with 12 game/activity booths, inflatable obstacle courses, wagon rides, food trucks and a vendor fair. We will also have some special events throughout the day (story times with Mrs. Claus & a local couple who write children's books, a puppeteer, Grant County Sheriff's Department K-9 Unit presentation, visit(s) from the Grinch, etc.). The game and activity booths are designed for kids to play and win tickets to redeem at our prize booth. Admission to this event is entirely free. Wristbands are required for children ages 1-17 to play games, win tickets and have access to the inflatable obstacle courses. Wristbands are \$15 each at the gate.

We are looking for volunteers to help run game booths throughout the day. All materials and instructions will be provided and we will have multiple orientation sessions available on July 10, 11 & 12 to provide guidance and answer any questions volunteers may have. ## **YQCA Information**



The Livestock Auction Committee has confirmed their requirements to sell an animal in the Grant County Fair Jr. Livestock Auction, Saturday of the Fair. Again, this year **ALL swine exhibitors showing or selling** and **all market exhibitors wishing to sell any other species in the auction** must be YQCA certified. A copy of your YQCA certificate must be turned in to the office prior to July 26 by 4:00 pm.

This interactive program provides youth a number of options for an annual quality assurance certification. YQCA was created for youth in the Beef, Dairy, Goat, Poultry, Rabbit, Sheep, and Swine projects. This program gives families more flexibility in acquiring this much needed information which trains youth in improving the care of food animals and promoting a higher level of consumer food safety. The livestock industry and businesses are constantly striving for high quality, wholesome products; therefore, youth in food animal projects should assist in this effort.

Online Training (\$12.00/youth) This type of training is at your own pace. <a href="yqcaprogram.org/">yqcaprogram.org/</a>

Once you have registered and completed the course, you will log back into your YQCA account and download a certificate. You must turn your certificate into the office at anytime before July 26 at 4:00 pm.
