Record Book Check:

Reminder to club leaders: All record book forms and books that need to come to the county level need to be turned into the Extension Office by October 1 in order to prepare for the County Record Book Check.

County Record Book Check is scheduled for Monday, October 14. Books will be available to score beginning at noon and we will wrap up around 7:00 pm or when all books have been scored. Please let Charisse Orth know if you plan to score record books.

Wisconsin 4-H Clubs and Groups Charters Due

A 4-H charter indicates the club or group is organized in accordance with the objectives of the 4-H program. It authorizes the club or group to use the 4-H emblem for educational purposes in accordance with laws and regulations established by Congress and the U.S. Department of Agriculture. The purpose of the 4-H Charter is education, communication, and accountability.

4-H clubs and groups must renew their charter annually through completion of the Charter Application Process. Charter Applications are to be completed online by **November 1st**.

4-H 2024-2025 Charter Application is now available on the Charters page of the Wisconsin 4-H volunteer website. The online version is the easiest, fastest way to submit, but you can also download printable pdf to fill out and return also. Grant County Fair Beef Identification:

December 2, 2024 - January 9, 2025 by 4:00 pm

Exhibitors wishing to show beef in the market division at the 2025 Grant County Fair will need to self identify their animal and turn in required paperwork before 4:00 pm on January 9, 2025 to the Grant County Extension Office. Tags will be available from the Grant County Extension Office in December.

More detailed information will be going out to members in the beef project. Forms and information will also be available at grant.extension.wisc.edu in December.

2024-2025 4-H Year Begins Now

Now is the time for families and members to enroll/re-enroll in 4-H online. 4-H enrollment is through https://wi.4honline.com/ and the 4-H year starts October 1. 4-H youth need to be in 5K through 13th grade.

All enrollments need to be done by December 1st to be listed on our mailing lists to stay current on upcoming events, deadlines and information. The deadline to enroll and change projects in order to exhibit at the Grant County Fair is April 1st.

Once you log in, you will have the ability to add projects and check and update any changes in your profile.




National 4-H Week is a great time to share 4-H with others. How will your club get involved?
