Grant County Cattlemen Scholarship Rules

A. Applicants must be residents of Grant County.

B. Applicants must plan on attending a 4-year university or a technical college/short course program of his or

her choice the following fall. At least one scholarship will be given to a student attending a 4-year college

or university and at least one scholarship will be given to a student attending a technical college or short

course program.

C. Applicants may be a graduating high school senior or in any year of college or program and may apply

multiple times. Preference may be given to those who have not received a Grant County Cattlemen

Scholarship in the past.

D. Applicants must have a background in the beef, veal, or dairy industry.

E. Preference may be given to those majoring in an agriculture related field.

F. Financial need may be a factor in determining the recipient of the scholarship.

G. Recipient of the scholarship is encouraged to attend the Grant County Cattlemen's annual meeting to be

recognized for receiving the scholarship.

H. To receive scholarship, recipients must provide the Grant County Cattlemen proof of their fall semester

grades no later than March 1 of the following calendar year. Scholarship payment will be made following

the approval of the Grant County Cattlemen Board of Directors at their next scheduled meeting.

I. There will be a runner-up selected in case for some reason the winner doesn't complete his or her education.

J. Applications must be returned by April 5, 2017.
