Also needed are **Adult Advisors** to ensure a strong camp experience by providing guidance and oversight to camp. Adult Advisors must be at least 21 years of age and certified as a 4-H leader. Upham Woods requires a ratio of the adults to youth to be 1:10... so we need your time and commitment to make this an educational and fun camp.

4-H Shooting Sports

The Grant County 4-H Shooting Sports practices monthly from January - June and host fair competition shoots in July and August. Shooting disciplines offered are Air Rifle, Archery, Air Pistol, .22 Rifle and Shotgun. In the winter months we are able to practice Archery and Air Rile indoors and the summer months we practice all disciplines outside. All equipment to participate is provided but youth are welcome to bring their own to practice if they prefer. Equipment safety checks will happen at the beginning of practice.

Participant Requirements:

- Archery and Air Rifle is open to any youth in 3rd grade and above.
- 22 Rifle, Air Pistol and Shotgun: youth must be 12 years or older and have completed hunter safety to participate.
- Members must enroll in one or more of the following projects they plan to practice in via 4hOnline by April 1; Air Rifle, Air Pistol, Archery, .22 Rifle. Shotgun or Shooting Sports.
- If you plan to compete in a fair competition shoot youth must attend at least two practices to participate in Fair Shoots.

Practices:

Practices will begin at 1:00 pm and usually last less than 2 hours. Winter/Spring practices will be at the Tri County Archery, 9145 Co Line Rd, Platteville, WI 53818 this is just outside of Arthur heading toward Rewey off of County Rd A.

What is the Rabbit 4-H Project all about?

Whether you see rabbits as soft and cuddly pets or a business opportunity, the rabbit project is flexible for your interest. Beginning level rabbits activities include selection, handling, breeds, parts, management, equipment, feeding, health, breeding and kindling. At the intermediate level through hands-on activities, you will learn how to select, judge, give oral reasons, show rabbits, tattoo, keep records and detect diseases. In the advanced level of the rabbits project, you will learn more about breeding, genetics, culling, determining pregnancy, designing a rabbitry, anatomy, teaching others, registering a rabbit and marketing your product.



What is the **Poultry 4-H Project** all about?

Explore the poultry industry, including turkeys, chickens, ducks, geese, pheasants, guinea hens, pigeons or quail. Learn about species and breeds, eggs, feather features, health, feeding, handling, washing, managing a flock, ethics, showing and careers.

Grant County Cattlemen Scholarship

Applicants must be residents of Grant County. Applicants must plan on attending a 4-year university or a technical college/short course program of his or her choice the following fall. At least one scholarship will be given to a student attending a 4-year college or university and at least one scholarship will be given to a student attending a technical college or short course program. Applicants may be a graduating high school senior or in any year of college or program and may apply multiple times. Preference may be given to those who have not received a Grant County Cattlemen Scholarship in the past. Applicants must have a background in the beef, veal, or dairy industry. Preference may be given to those majoring in an agriculture related field. Financial need may be a factor in determining the recipient of the scholarship. Recipient of the scholarship is encouraged to attend the Grant County Cattlemen's annual meeting to be recognized for receiving the scholarship. To receive scholarship, recipients must provide the Grant County Cattlemen proof of their fall semester grades no later than March 1 of the following calendar year. Recipients must assist the cattlemen with at least 2 or more fundraisers or events in order to be eligible to receive their scholarship. Scholarship payment will be made following the approval of the Grant County Cattlemen Board of Directors at their next scheduled meeting.

Poster Contest for the Grant County Fair

The Grant County Fair is continuing our poster contest for students to participate in 7th, 8th, and 9th grades. If you choose to participate, all entries must be in to the Grant County Fair, 916 E. Elm Street Suite B, Lancaster, WI 53813 **no later than 3:00 p.m. on May 3, 2024.** The sooner the better. No entries will be accepted after that date and time. Below are the guidelines to enter along with a form to be completed that gets attached to the back of each poster.

Contest Rules

- A fully completed entry form must be attached to the back of the poster to make it eligible for judging. No other entry forms will be eligible for participation.
- Any media may be used to create a flat or two-dimensional effect (paint, crayon, colored pencil, charcoal, paper or other materials on regular poster) please no computer imagery
- Poster size must be between 8.5" x 11" and 12" x 18".
- Posters should be packaged so they remain flat when sent for judging.
- All posters must be created by an individual student rather than a team of students.

The 2024 title "It's Kind of a Pig Deal", the date "August 14-18, 2024", and "Grant County Fair" must be on your poster. (Don't use any other title.)

An individual student may only enter in one grade level.

Entry forms should be submitted to the Grant County Fair, who will contact the winners for prize distribution. The members of the Grant County Fair Board shall sponsor the contest. The contest deadline is **May 3, 2024.**

Poster Evaluations

• The posters are evaluated based on visual effectiveness, originality, and neatness.

Prizes

- First place entry in grade 7th, 8th, and 9th will receive 1 season pass and \$25.00.
- Second place entry in grade 7th, 8th and 9th will receive 1 season pass and \$20.00.
- Third place entry in grade 7th, 8th and 9th will receive 1 season pass and \$15.00.

All entries will be judged by the Grant County Fair Board. An email went out to all 4-H leaders and art teachers at surrounding schools. We will get in touch with the poster contest winners as soon as they are judged. Be creative and have fun! Some of the top posters will be displayed at the fairgrounds all summer.



New Rules/Information for 2024 Fair

Beef – No exhibitor may enter more than 3 animals in the junior beef department.

Sheep - No exhibitor may enter more than 6 animals in the junior sheep department.

Goat - No exhibitor may enter more than 6 animals in the junior goat department. Please refer to the Grant County Fair's website for more information on these three departments for changes.

New lot numbers for entering **Sheep and Goats**

Sheep – Entering a market class sheep use lot #1 for all entries (based on maximum rule) and lot #9 for pen of wethers. Lots #2-8 will still be in the fair management system on the computer to break down entries into lots based on weight after all entries are in, even though those numbers are not printed in the fairbook. All lots will print on the judges sheet for show day.

Goats – Entering a market class goat use lot #17 for dairy goats and lot #20 for meat goats (based on maximum rule). Lots #18,19,21&22 will still be in the fair management system on the computer to break down entries into lots based on weight after all entries are in, even though those numbers are not printed in the fairbook. All lots will print on the judges sheet for show day.

REMINDER for **Goat** Exhibitors – You need to choose dairy or meat showmanship before the fair. It must be included on the your entry blank.

New lot numbers for entering Swine

Swine – Entering a market class swine use lot #1 for all entries (based on maximum rule). Lots #2-3 will still be in the fair management system on the computer to break down entries into lots based on weight after all entries are in, even though those numbers are not printed in the fairbook. All lots will print on the judges sheet for show day.

YQCA Information



The Livestock Auction Committee has confirmed their requirements to sell an animal in the Grant County Fair Jr. Livestock Auction, Saturday of the Fair. Again, this year **ALL swine exhibitors showing or selling** and **all market exhibitors wishing to sell any other species in the auction** must be YQCA certified. A copy of your YQCA certificate must be turned in to the office prior to fair entry deadline in July.

This interactive program provides youth a number of options for an annual quality assurance certification. YQCA was created for youth in the Beef, Dairy, Goat, Poultry, Rabbit, Sheep, and Swine projects. This program gives families more flexibility in acquiring this much needed information which trains youth in improving the care of food animals and promoting a higher level of consumer food safety. The livestock industry and businesses are constantly striving for high quality, wholesome products; therefore, youth in food animal projects should assist in this effort.

- Online Training (\$12.00/youth) This type of training is at your own pace. yqcaprogram.org/
- In-Person Training (\$3.00/youth) Online registration is still required. If low registration, training may be cancelled. Make sure to register by the deadline listed. In-person trainings are scheduled for:
 - April 7 at 3:00 pm, South Room at the Youth & Ag Center, Lancaster—pre-register by April 4
 - April 28 at 3:00 pm, South Room at the Youth & Ag Center, Lancaster—pre-register by April 25
 - Youth can attend other counties/trainings that are listed on the online registration system.

Once you have registered and completed the course, you will log back into your YQCA account and download a certificate. You must turn your certificate into the office at anytime before fair entry deadline in July.
