### Wisconsin 4-H Clubs and Groups Charters Due

A 4-H charter indicates the club or group is organized in accordance with the objectives of the 4-H program. It authorizes the club or group to use the 4-H emblem for educational purposes in accordance with laws and regulations established by Congress and the U.S. Department of Agriculture. The purpose of the 4-H Charter is education, communication, and accountability.

4-H clubs and groups must renew their charter annually through completion of the Charter Application Process. Charter Applications are to be completed online by **November 1st**.

4-H 2024-2025 Charter Application is now available on the Charters page of the Wisconsin 4-H volunteer website. The online version is the easiest, fastest way to submit, but you can also download printable pdf to fill out and return also. We encourage all clubs and groups to work together through the planning process.

#### 4-H Club Annual Financial Review

Every year each 4-H Club or 4-H Group with their own checkbook is required to complete the 4-H Annual Financial Review to be in compliance with the 501c3 tax exempt status. The Annual Financial Form is due to Extension Office before September 1, 2025. This deadline is extremely important! If forms are not turned in on time you could lose your tax exempt and club status.

Forms can be found at the website above and Charisse will be emailing club leaders and groups with forms and guidelines to complete all the steps to successfully complete the Annual Financial Report. If you have any questions please reach out to Charisse.
