RE: Beef Identification and Weigh-In for Grant County Fair

If you potentially will be showing beef in the market division at the Grant County Fair, see below for the self-identification/weigh-in process. All market division beef need to be id'd if showing at the Grant County Fair. Each member can identify up to 5 beef animals per member within immediate family. **Deadline for all beef id and weigh-ins is Friday, January 9, 2026, by 4:00 pm** into the Grant County Extension Office.

The enclosed information sheet will go into the details of how to identify/weigh-in. We will accept id forms, pictures and proof of animal weight by: e-mailing to jenny.dixon@wisc.edu, by dropping off at the Extension Office by January 9, 2026 before 4:00 pm or by mailing in with a postmark no later than January 9.

To participate in the <u>optional</u> rate of gain, animals can only be weighed between December 1 and January 9 to be eligible.

- The <u>Belmont Sale Barn</u> will be open for beef weigh-ins on December 20 from 9:00 am Noon for exhibitors wishing to utilize their scales for proof of weight for rate of gain. Their address is 26770 Sale Barn Lane, Belmont, WI.
- Bloomington Livestock Exchange will also be open for the use of their scales on January 3 from 1:00 - 3:00 pm. Bloomington Livestock Exchange's address is 9663 Cty Hwy A, Bloomington.
- Note: These locations are not required. These are just two options for exhibitors who wish to utilize their scale date. Other scales can be used with proof of weight to meet the Rate of Gain requirement. Again, rate of gain is optional and not a requirement to show or sell at the Grant County Fair.

Market heifers (not breeding stock) can be exhibited in the market classes with the market steers and will be included in the champion drive for Champion Overall Market Beef and are allowed to be sold in the meat animal auction. It is important to note that if a heifer is shown in the market classes, she cannot also be shown in the breeding classes.

RFID Tags: Market cattle that will be shown at the Grant County Fair will need to be tagged with a radio frequency tag (RFID/EID). You can use your own RFID/EID tags or pick them up from the Grant County Extension Office.

All exhibitors are to submit their Grant County Fair beef ID form, including the premise identification number, to Grant County. All premises that contain or host livestock are required by the State of Wisconsin to have a Premise ID. The Premise Identification Program is the first step in a national animal identification program to help ensure the health and safety of the nation's meat supply.

Please remember to fill out the Beef Id Form completely, including circling bred/owned.

Bred/Owned Definition:

Any animal whose dam is owned by the exhibitor or a member of the immediate family (father, mother, brother, sister, or legal guardian only), at the time of birth, and is born on the local property that is owned or managed by the immediate family of the exhibitor. The animal must be cared for from birth to exhibition by the exhibitor on the local property. The dam does not have to be owned by the exhibitor/family at the time of breeding.

Reminder of Fair Requirements

Remember to check the Grant County Fairbook for complete rules and requirements to show and sell beef at the fair. The fairbook can be found online at https://funonforty.co.grant.wi.gov/ at a later date or by contacting Amy Olson, Fair Director, at 608-723-2135. Below are a few of the rules pertaining to the beef requirements:

- All animals must be castrated and dehorned before the date you identify your steer, no later than January 9.
- Members can identify up to 5 beef, dairy, or dairy/beef cross per member within immediate family.
- All exhibitors in the junior fair division shall be members of Grant County 4-H, FFA, FCCLA, scouting programs, breed groups, or any other recognized youth organization under adult leadership and with an approved educational program in the project area.
- Members in good standing who have completed 4th grade by the time of fair are eligible to sell one animal at the Grant County Fair, as long as they have not reached their 20th birthday by January 1, 2026.
- Each beef, dairy beef, dairy, goat, sheep, poultry and rabbit exhibitor planning to sell at the fair and all swine exhibitors must obtain a current YQCA certification. More YQCA details can be found in the Grant County 4-H Echo starting in February or by contacting the Grant County Extension Office.

Steps to ID Your Beef Animal

- 1. Members can identify up to 5 beef total; dairy, miniature, or dairy/beef cross steers/market heifers, per member within immediate family. You can use your own RFID/EID tags if they meet the requirements, or pick them up from the Grant County Extension Office. Tags are available for pick-up at the Grant County Extension Office Monday Friday, 8:00 am 4:30 pm. Call the Extension Office at 608-723-2125 if you need to make other arrangements to pick up tags outside of office hours.
- 2. Tag your animal with the RFID/EID (Radio Frequency Identification) tags.
- 3. Once the tag is attached in the animal's ear, take a close-up picture that shows the tag number clearly. This picture will need to be clear enough to read all of the numbers on the tag. The picture does not need to be of the full animal, just a close-up of the tagged ear.
- 4. If you are participating in Rate of Gain, proof of the animal's weight needs to be turned in with your completed information. Animals can only be weighed between December 1 and January 9. Proof of weight can be a weight slip from a scale or a picture of the weight read-out on a scale. Please label your proof of weight slips or picture to correspond to a specific ear tag number. Note the weight and date weighed on the id form. Rate of Gain is optional and not required to show or sell.

- 6. The deadline to turn in all of your id information is **Friday**, **January 9**, **2026 by 4:00 pm**. ID information can also be postmarked January 9 at the latest. Checklist

REMEMBER:

- 1. No exhibitor may enter both open and junior class
- 2. Exhibitors must have completed 4th grade prior to fair to sell in the Livestock Auction
- 3. Exhibitors may not sell at more than 2 fairs after their scheduled high school graduation
- 4. Members may only exhibit in the department in which they carry a project
- 5. Members exhibiting livestock, including dairy, must upon request be able to show that animals exhibited have been cared for by the exhibitor for a period of at least 3 months previous to the fair
- 6. Look at the department and have the proper paperwork done including animal identification deadlines, YQCA certificates, and registration forms
- 7. Be sure to check out the current Fair Book for rules that my apply to your exhibit

Department 2 Beef Cattle

Forms needed to show a beef animal at the Grant County Fair

Market class animals (steer or heifer) must have been identified. A completed identification form, RFID tagged, picture of the RFID tag in the ear, and optional proof of weight must have been submitted to the Grant County Extension Office by January 9, 2026 by 4:00 pm.

- 1. Junior Class Entry Form
- 2. Animal ID & Vet Check Information Sheet Bring with you to the fair
- 3. All exhibitors who plan to stay overnight must register by completing the <u>Registration Form for an Overnight</u>

 Pass

Forms needed to participate in the livestock auction. Due to Hybrid Livestock Auction, proper sale pictures of you and your animal together will be taken at the Grant County Fair. These will also be used as the buyer's appreciation pictures.

- 1. <u>Junior Class Entry Form</u> (with animal listed in a market class)
- 2. Consignment Sheet
- 3. Animal ID & Vet Check Information Sheet Bring with you to the fair
- 4. YQCA Certificate yqcaprogram.org is the website to get certified to sell

Youth must be YQCA certified and a copy of your YQCA Certificate must be turned in with your entry by the Fair entry deadline of July 24. No YQCA certificates will be accepted after 4:00 pm on July 24, 2026.
