

# Grant County 4-H Leaders' Mini Grant Application Guidelines

The Grant County 4-H Leaders' Board is proud to announce their 9<sup>th</sup> annual grant program. This grant process has been met with overwhelming enthusiasm and creativity each year. We are hoping for a similar response for 2026. Please find below some guidelines that **MUST** be met for the grant to be considered.

1. All grants should be hand written by the individual who is applying for the grant. While we hope the grants will be neat and legible, it is just as important that each leader and member write in their own words and handwriting, their answers.
2. All grants must be turned in on time. Any grants postmarked after the date listed, shall not be considered.
3. The purchase of animals or feed shall not be considered. Items that assist in maintaining the project or exhibition of the project will be considered.
4. We ask that items to be purchased are such that can be used by future members and passed on and not one time use items. If a member or leader choses to discontinue the project(s), please find another member to pass the item on to for continued use.
5. Please be creative and thoughtful when answering the questions giving as much information for the board to evaluate.
6. **NO GRANTS WILL BE DISTRIBUTED UNTIL A THANK YOU NOTE IS RECEIVED. IF THANK YOU NOTES ARE NOT RECEIVED BY JUNE 1, THE GRANT WILL NOT BE DISPERSED.**
7. Not all grants will be funded and some grants may only be partially funded. Please include, if applicable, other funding opportunities available.
8. If members were to apply for a new project grant and a continuing project grant, only one grant may be funded.
9. Members may be awarded grant funds in multiple years and the selection committee will take in to consideration the number of times funds have been received before awarding funds, to ensure funds are supporting the most youth possible.
